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


The participants, composed of Librarians from different campuses, Faculty and students from the

Ms. Rovilyn D. Somcio, University Librarian headed the campus and library tour of the guests making sure they are comfortable and secure during their visit.





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he Library Extension Program (LIBRO) is an extension program of the university Library with the Nabitasan Integrated School (NIS) as its Beneficiary.

In collaboration with the ISAT U Artist Guild, the University library started the phase 1 of the project for NIS, to have a library as an "Information Hub: A Gender-Based School Library". Three consecutive Saturdays of November 2024 were scheduled for the mural painting and other activities. The highlight of the event was the presentation of attire of all academic and non teaching personnel who joined the program.
















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The University Library organized a book fair on September 10-12, 2024. The activity which was participated by eight Book Dealers created a positive impact on its clientele.



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


University Library Occupies the New Building








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Coffee Write Nook
